Beatles: British rock band from the 1960s.

Eagles: American country-rock group in 1970s

Alice In Chains: Grunge band from Seattle, Washington that rose to fame in the early 90s.

Bass: Low-frequency stringed instrument often featured in rock music.

Drums: Percussion instruments used to keep a beat in rock bands.

Foo Fighters: American rock band founded by Nirvana drummer Dave Grohl in 1994.

Fuzz: Distorted sound created by overdriving guitar amplifiers, popularized by psychedelic and garage rock.

Grunge: Sub-genre of rock featuring angsty lyrics and distorted guitar sound.

Guitar: Musical instrument used by many rock bands.

Horns: Wind instruments such as trumpets and saxophones that are often used in jazz and funk-rock styles.

Jammin': Improvising during performance with other members of the band, usually instrumentalists; seen often in jazz.

Metal: Hard, aggressive form of rock music with fast tempos and electric guitars.

Muse: English alt-rock trio that blends elements of classical music with progressive rock.

Oasis: British alternative rock group popularized during the Britpop movement of the 1990s.

Pearl Jam: Pioneers of grunge who achieved mainstream success with albums like Ten and Vs.

Riffing: Repeated musical phrase played on the guitar to create an infectious groove, common in classic rock.

Vocals: Lead singer of a band, a staple of rock music.
